## Groundhogs, also called woodchucks, are mammals that live in woodland areas. They dig long tunnels in the ground with their sharp claws. As they dig they eat insects that they find.

They dig rooms along the tunnel to make their home. This home is called a **burrow**. Some rooms are for babies, (**kits**), and others are for sleeping, eating and using the bathroom. They keep their home clean.

with a short furry tail. On its face

there are **whiskers** for feeling

In many of the **forests** of North America you will find beavers. Beavers are mammals that stay busy building their homes with trees and mud. Their home is called a lodge and can only be entered by swimming underwater.

More than one beaver lives in the lodge. This is where the mother beaver has her babies called "kits". The beavers eat leaves, bark and twigs.

Beavers are strong swimmers. They have clear eyelids that act as goggles to see underwater. They can stay underwater for 15 minutes. DIFFERENT

When cold weather comes groundhogs go in their burrow to **hibernate**. This means they sleep till spring.
